

## RECIPE BOX

## Why not try some new Thanksgiving traditions this year with these festive recipes!

## **Pumpkin Dessert Squares**

### Preheat Oven to 350

### **Bottom Layer:**

1-18 ½ ounce pack yellow cake mix—reserve 1 cup for Top layer

1 egg

½ cup melted butter or margarine Grease the bottom of an oblong cake pan. Making sure you've saved 1 cup of cake mix, combine the remaining cake mix, butter and egg. Press this mixture in pan.

## Middle Layer:

1 lb. or 14 oz. can pumpkin (not puree or pumpkin pie mix)

2 eggs

2/3 cup milk

Mix the above three ingredients until smooth and pour over unbaked crust.

## **Top Layer:**

1 cup reserved dry cake mix

¼ cup sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

¼ Cup butter (Do Not Melt)

Combine above 4 ingredients to make crumbs and sprinkle over the top.

Bake at 350 for 45-50 minutes.

Makes approximately 28-32 1-1 ½" squares



## Morton's Copycat Brussels Sprouts

Serves 2 to 4
24 ounces of brussels
sprouts
(trim off the brown stem)
1 gallon water
(for blanching)



½ cup table salt (to add to the blanching water) 4 ounces shallots peeled and julienned (1/8 inch thin)

Pepper, white ground "to taste" approx ¼ tsp

After removing the brown stem from the sprouts,

4 ounces bacon sliced into 1 inch strips

2 ounces butter, unsalted

Salt, "to taste" approx ½ tsp

blanch the brussels sprouts in the 1 gallon of boiling water with 1/2 cup of table salt added. When done, the sprouts should be cooked completely through but still firm. Approx 6 to 9 minutes When sprouts are ready, immediately shock them in an ice bath to stop the cooking. When the sprouts are completely cooled, remove from the ice bath allow them to drain and reserve. Slice the sprouts in half lengthwise. Place a large sauté pan over medium heat Add the cut bacon to the pan and cook until fairly crisp, approx 3 - 1/3 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat and allow to cool for approximately 2 minutes. Add the butter to the bacon making sure that the pan is not so hot as to burn the bacon. When the butter has melted, return the pan to the flame (medium heat) and add the shallots and the brussels sprouts. Sauté for approximately 4 minutes, tossing frequently so the shallots and bacon do not burn. Season with the salt and pepper, taste a sprout to adjust the seasoning. Place in a warm serving dish and serve immediately.

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

## SHE'S CRAFTY

## **Guy Fawkes Day**



In 1605, thirteen young men planned to blow up the British Houses of

Parliament. Among them was Guy Fawkes, Britain's most notorious

traitor. To carry out their plan, the conspirators got hold of 36 barrels of gunpowder - and stored them in a cellar, just under the House of Lords. A warning letter reached the King that this was going to take place, and the King's forces made plans to stop the conspirators. On the night that the Gunpowder Plot was foiled, on November 5th, 1605, bonfires were set to celebrate the safety of the King. Since then, November 5th has become known as Bonfire Night. The

event is commemorated every year with

fireworks and burning effigies of Guy Fawkes on a bonfire.

Create your own firework art by making your own scratch art paper!

#### **Materials:**

- white card stock cut into postcard-size pieces (roughly 4" x 6")
- Oil pastels
- painter's tape
- small roller brush or paintbrush
- black tempera paint and a little dish soap
- shallow bowls
- toothpicks, forks or other items to scratch with

#### What to do:

**Cover the surface you are working on** since this is a messy project! Tape the backs of your cards to the work surface so they don't move too.

**Using painter's tape,** mask off the edges of each postcard.

**Cover the entire postcard with crayon.** This is an important step. You can either use one color of pastel or multiple colors. I recommend using a few colors so you've got lots of fun colors to make your fireworks with!

**Mix the paint with a little dish soap.** The soap helps the paint adhere to the oil pastels. Pour into a shallow bowl.

Using your roller brush, cover the entire card with the paint-soap mixture. Let dry.

**Repeat with additional coats** as necessary until the entire surface is covered. Let dry completely. **Peel the tape off the cards carefully** so as not to rip the card stock. When the cards are finished, scratch them using toothpicks, chopsticks, forks, etc. to make drawings.











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


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## KIDS' BOOK CLUB

## **Giving Thanks**

Each day, move a handprint to the Thankful tree that can be used as a centerpiece during Thanksgiving dinner!

## **WOD for Warriors**



Team RWB's mission is to enrich the lives of America's veterans by connecting them to their community through physical and social activity. On Veterans Day and Memorial Day, gyms across the nation participate in WOD with Warriors, a functional fitness tribute workout. WOD with Warriors supports Team Red, White and Blue through donation collections and awareness of their mission to enrich the lives of America's veterans.

**So what is WOD for Warriors?** First, let's have a quick history lesson: on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War. This Armistice Day was later re-named to Veterans Day. At exactly 11 a.m., each November 11th, a color guard, made up of members from each of the military branches, renders honors to America's war dead during a ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery.

And how does WOD for Warriors bring awareness to Veterans Day? The workout's 11-based rep scheme represents the rich history of Veterans Day. Included in the workout are also two-minutes of rest/reflection which represents this moment of silence at the Tomb of the Unknowns. The 1st round of work represents Veterans of wars past, and the 2nd round of work represents Veterans of present and future wars. The workout consists of modified versions of classic military exercises that are meant to help connect Veterans and the greater community to connect after the accomplishment of shared hardship during this WOD.
